From our HOA President

As we approach the halfway point of our fiscal year (FY) 2022 Operating Expenses, I thought it would be helpful to provide a midyear summary. As many of us personally, as well as businesses are struggling with higher costs, we as an Association are facing many of the same struggles. In many areas our costs are increasing more than what was budgeted and planned for in FY 2022.

We continue to monitor our expenses on a monthly basis as we work to maintain our costs within the FY 2022 budget. Many of our expenses, pool chemicals, seed and fertilizer, insurance, and utilities to name a few, have seen significant increases this year. This is putting a strain on our ability to maintain our HOA budget.

There have been comments from homeowners that we should just use our reserve accounts to fund our operating expenses. There are two reserve accounts, one for the Land Lease payments and one for capital improvements. Unfortunately, it is not legal to use those funds as they are allocated for reserves and to be used for the Land Lease and for capital improvements and cannot be used for the payment of operating expenses.

At the July board meeting, the board of directors completed a 6-month review of expenses through the end of June and estimated the remaining FY to determine where we feel the Operating Expenses will end in 2022. Based on the finance

committee's analysis and the increase in costs, the board has determined that some of the budgeted items will not occur, such as summer grass seeding and planting of miscellaneous shrubs. In addition, some expenses are anticipated to not be as high as budgeted, such as irrigation repairs, tree trimming, printing, and postage. These expenses have been adjusted to reflect the changes. Hopefully, these actions will help us meet our projected budget for FY 2022.

We will continue to monitor our expenditures monthly and take appropriate actions as needed.

Gutter and Downspout maintenance

The palm tree flower bloom was extensive this year and has caused gutters to fill with debris. With the winds and some rainfall, we have had this year, the amount of sand and debris that has run off your tile roof and settled into your gutters is always extensive. Palm tree flowers were also more prolific than usual, and this has created an annual problem with our gutters and downspouts.

Summer is a good time to have your gardener or handy man clean your gutters and downspouts. Our heavy, quick rains can fill and you're your downspouts very quickly. Cleaning them will prevent water from backing up and damaging your roof, and in some cases, interior walls have received damage from clogged downspouts. Cleaning gutters and downspouts will also prevent mud and debris from covering your patios.
